Registration opens November 9, 2009, for Spring 2010 Morningside graduate classes. This flyer lists the endorsement and master's degree program courses that are available in various locations in the state of Iowa as well as online. Please note the course number and section number.

You may register for any section of a course that is offered totally online. These section numbers would be 095, A95, B95, etc. Regardless of the section number, the dates of the course are the same (unless otherwise noted).

To enroll in any of the classes, please register online if you are a continuing student. (New students will need to call the office to register because their student accounts will not yet be established.) Tuition will increase to \$170 per credit hour effective for summer term courses.

Online Registration

Students who have previously registered with Morningside will register online. Others will need to call the Graduate Office at 800-831-0806, x5375 to register. Any student with an unpaid balance will be unable to register in either format.

1. Go to <http://my.morningside.edu/>.
2. On the left side, click CampusWeb (in the purple area).
3. Enter your account information, that is, your Login ID and PIN. (Your Login ID is your 7-digit student ID.) Click the "Login!" button.
4. On the left side are a number of account options. To register, select My Registration near the bottom of the list of options.
5. You will enter your current e-mail address. You will enter it twice for verification. Click "continue" to advance to the next screen.
6. Next to Department, click the Choose Department drop down list. Although you will see many departments, there are only two choices that pertain to you: Education (EDUC) or Special Education (SPED). Click Education (EDUC) or Special Education (SPED). Click Search.

All of the available courses will now be displayed by course number and section number. Scroll down to the class you want and click "add." Note that section numbers are based on where the instructor is located. The section numbers are located immediately after the course number in this brochure. When you have chosen all of the courses you want, click the "submit" button. You should now see a confirmation page. (If you didn't see the confirmation message, you probably didn't click "submit" button. Please go back and do this.)

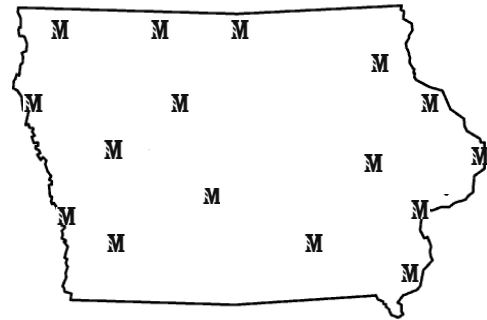

General Information

Financial Aid

There is limited financial aid for graduate students. Students interested in applying for financial aid must:

- ◇ be an admitted student in the Morningside College Graduate Program (prior to the start of the semester the student is requesting aid);
- ◇ have completed a 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) www.fafsa.ed.gov and have it sent to Morningside College (Federal School Code 001879)
- ◇ complete and return the Morningside College Financial Aid Application for Graduate Students
- ◇ and register each term for a minimum of 6 hours of graduate credit at the Morningside tuition rate for most financial aid

All of these items must be completed in a timely manner in order for the Office of Student Financial Planning to disburse aid while the student is enrolled during each term. The Morningside Financial Aid Application must be submitted for each term for which financial aid is sought. Students seeking an Endorsement may only receive aid for classes required for that endorsement.
